How many did you miss? What if this was a test and you only missed one question. Do you know what your grade would be? It would be an "F". That is right. "F" for Fail.

Did you notice the answer to the last question? James 2:10 says, "For whosoever shall keep the whole law, and yet offend in one point, he is guilty of all."

So if you missed one question in the quiz, you missed them all, but not only on this quiz. If you have ever in your entire life broken one of God's laws then you are a lawbreaker and are guilty of breaking all of them.

You might think that one law isn't a big deal, but just remember the Garden of Eden. Adam and Eve were expelled from the Garden because of breaking ONE commandment of God. They were never allowed back into the Garden and died the promised death for their sin.

What about you?

Have you ever committed a sin? Have you ever told a lie? The Bible says in Leviticus 19:11, "Ye shall not steal, neither deal falsely, neither lie one to another." How about stealing? Have you ever stolen anything? Have you ever stolen from God? Malachi 3:8 says, "Will a man rob God? Yet ye have robbed me. But ye say, Wherein have we robbed thee? In tithes and offerings." How many times have you earned money that was never tithed? God considers this stealing from Him.

Where will you stand?

The Bible says in Hebrews 9:27, "It is

appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment." It also says in Romans 2:12, "For as many as have sinned without law shall also perish without law: and as many as have sinned in the law shall be judged by the law." Don't think that you are exempt because you are part of a church either, for in 1 Peter 4:17 it says, "For the time is come that judgment must begin at the house of God: and if it first begin at us, what shall the end be of them that obey not the gospel of God?"

Jesus is coming soon. Isaiah 63:3 tells of the day when He will come to bring judgment. It says, "I will tread them in mine anger, and trample them in my fury; and their blood shall be sprinkled upon my garments, and I will stain all my raiment." Hebrews 10:31 rightly says, "It is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God."

What will you say when you stand before God? All excuses will be worthless then. When the list of your deeds is presented before Him, what hope will you have?

There is One that can change the outcome of our judgment. John 3:16 says, "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not

perish, but have everlasting life." The Bible teaches in Colossians 2:14 that when Jesus died on the cross He was, "Blotting out the handwriting of ordinances that was against us." He was then raised from the dead that we might be raised in newness of life.

If your sins are forgiven by Jesus, then you do not need to fear death and judgment. If you would like to be forgiven you can pray this prayer.

PRAYER

Father God, I know that I have sinned. I have broken your commandments. I know that you sent your Son Jesus Christ to die for my sins. I also believe that He died and rose again. Today I repent of my sins, and I ask that you will please forgive me. Come into my life and make me new. I want to serve you for the rest of my life, and I want to go to heaven when I die.
